In its efforts to support local conservation efforts, the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Foundation has established a Commemorative Tree Planting and Memorial Bench program, providing donors with the opportunity to celebrate the life of a loved one or an important milestone while supporting reforestation and forest management throughout the Niagara watershed.

Five commemorative forests have been established at the following conservation areas:

- Woodend Recognition Grove, Niagara-on-the-Lake
- Virgil Memorial Forest, Virgil
- Cave Springs Carolinian Assemblage, Beamsville
- Binbrook Memorial Forest, Binbrook
- Ball's Falls Memorial Forest, Jordan

COMMEMORATIVE TREES

Planting trees and shrubs contribute to a healthy community by continually renewing the air we breathe and helping to reduce the effects of harmful pollutants. Trees reduce the effects of flooding, stabilize soils and prevent erosion and provide necessary habitat for resident wildlife.

Your donation will support the planting of native species trees, creating a natural legacy for future generations. Your living gift, celebrating the life of a loved one or recognizing important events such as birthdays and anniversaries, will provide lasting recognition while enhancing our natural community.

Recognition labels are not attached to the trees or shrubs to ensure their continued good health. However, the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority will be pleased to send a Living Tribute Certificate to the individual or next-of-kin to acknowledge your thoughtful gift. In addition, all donors will receive an official tax receipt for the full amount of each donation.

COMMEMORATIVE BENCHES

Benches are available, with final determination of suitable locations and bench style at the discretion of Conservation Authority staff. Pricing includes the costs of the bench, installation, plaque, surfacing and maintenance for a period of ten years from the date of purchase. Plaques are approximately 4" x 6" and may contain messages of up to five lines.

TO DATE, DONATIONS TO THE FOUNDATION HAVE SUPPORTED THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

- The collection of artifacts and the restoration of the historic church at Ball's Falls Conservation Area
- The acquisition of 16 acres of Escarpment property and improvement to the education centre at Woodend Conservation Area
- Creating full access pathways and fishing piers at St. Johns Conservation Area, improving the area for visitors with mobility challenges
- Installing fishing piers and creating a lakeside recreation trail at Chippawa Creek Conservation Area
- Replacing observation platforms and improving the natural trail at Beamer Memorial Conservation Area, providing visitors with a safe view of the breathtaking escarpment vistas and viewing the annual hawk migration
- Establishing a scholarship bursary for post-secondary education in the field of conservation
- Leading the campaign to purchase and protect the Wainfleet Bog, the largest undisturbed wetland property in Southern Ontario
- Developing a recreational trail network in the Twenty Valley in Jordan to enhance the outdoor experience along the Niagara Escarpment
- Assisting in the restoration and rehabilitation efforts along the Welland River, the largest watercourse in the NPCA's area of jurisdiction
